The Rainbow Flag

Designed by San Francisco artist Gilbert Baker in 1978, the Rainbow Flag first flew in the San Francisco Gay Freedom Day Parade on June 25, 1978. It consists of six stripes, with the colours red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and violet, each with their own meaning. It is an inclusive symbol for all sexual and gender identities around the world.
